

One minute

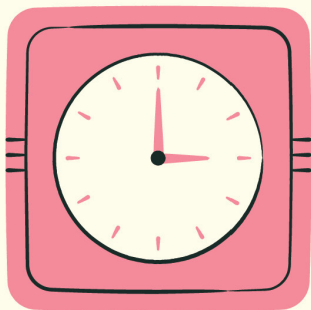
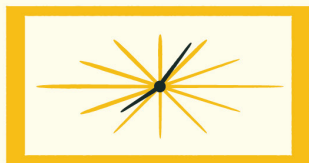
Do you have the gift of the gab?

OBJECT OF THE GAME

Talk non-stop on any topic.

HOW TO PLAY

- One player picks a discussion topic — you can choose anything so get creative.
- Other players have to talk about the topic non-stop for one whole minute.
- Players who pause, say “um” or repeat something that’s already been said are eliminated.



I'm sorry I'm late

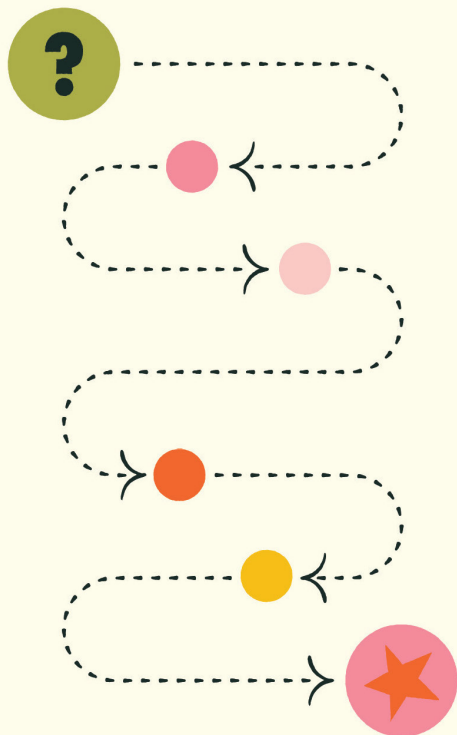
Steal excuses from your favorite films.

OBJECT OF THE GAME

Guess the movie behind the gloriously ridiculous excuse.

HOW TO PLAY

- The game starts with one player saying, "I'm sorry I'm late" followed by a reason for their lateness.
- The twist? The excuse must be taken from a movie plot.
- For example: "I'm sorry I'm late, I discovered my brother was pretending to be my father, broke my most beloved possession, got stranded on a garbage planet, had to defeat the evil sister I never knew I had, lost an eye and then saw my home destroyed."
- The answer: *Thor: Ragnarok*.



Degrees of separation

Find the missing links.

OBJECT OF THE GAME

Connect the dots between two seemingly completely unrelated things.

HOW TO PLAY

- Based on the theory that everything in the world is connected by six degrees of separation or less, this game starts with a person naming two unrelated things.
- Other people must connect them using a series of plausible associations.
- For example: If the first person says, “Elvis Presley and fish” the other might say, “Elvis died on the toilet, toilets have pipes, pipes lead to the ocean, fish live in the ocean.”
- The person to make the link using the least number of statements wins.



Name the most

How many can you name?

OBJECT OF THE GAME

Naming as many things within a category as you can.

HOW TO PLAY

- Decide on a category and go around the car to see how many related items you can name. For example, superheroes or pasta shapes.
- Once you skip, you are out of the round and the last person able to name something wins.
- You can switch it up by having players bet on who can name the most within the shortest amount of time. If challenged, each opponent must provide as many answers as they can within five seconds. Whoever stumbles first, loses.



Guess the song

Attention divas and aspiring DJs, this one's for you.

OBJECT OF THE GAME

Show off your encyclopedic knowledge of music.

HOW TO PLAY

- Turn the radio on and just let the music play, or choose a long playlist on Spotify (such as, Best of the 90s, or similar) and put it on shuffle.
- The first person to name the song wins a point.
- Keep going and the person with the most points at the end of the trip wins.
- For a more challenging version of the game, appoint a DJ to play the first 10 seconds of each song, hit pause then guess away.
